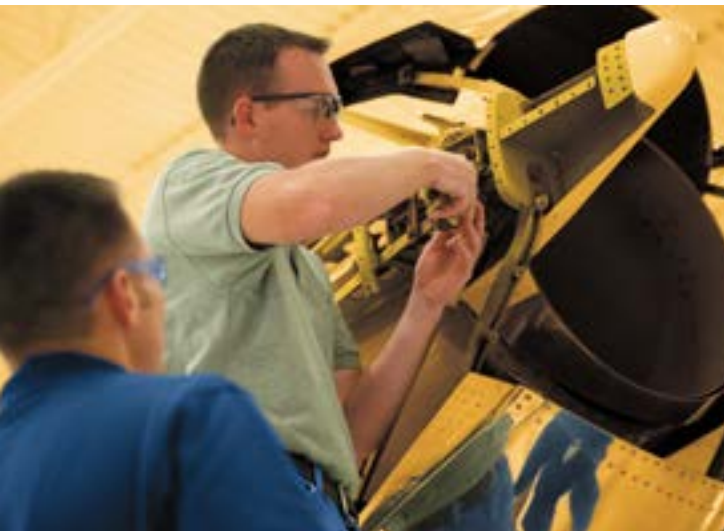

Course Length – Does not include flight training or simulator check days, if required. All flight training is done in a customer provided aircraft and is not required in most cases for course completion.

ATP Prerequisites – FlightSafety is able to administer Airline Transport Certificate (ATP) Checks during the Pilot Initial and Prior Experience Course. To qualify, pilots must meet the requirements of 14 CFR Part 61.155 through 61.159.

Prior Experience Course – This course is designed for pilots who are seeking the addition of an ATP. These pilots must have completed an FAA-approved course which led to a type rating prior to enrollment. In addition, this course is also for those pilots who have been flying the aircraft as SIC and now want to obtain a Type Rating. These pilots must have completed an FAA-approved pilot initial.
