Prerequisite for Initial Course – A pilot training for initial qualification in the Leonardo AW139 helicopter may enroll in this course if the pilot:

Holds at least a Private Pilot helicopter certificate and an unrestricted helicopter instrument rating, or ATP certificate- Not limited to VFR only.

Prerequisites for Initial 61.157 Course – A pilot applying for an ATP Certificate may enroll in this course if the pilot:

1. Holds at least a Private Pilot Certificate (§61.63), Commercial Pilot Certificate (§61.63), ATP Certificate (§61.157), or to add a rotorcraft ATP to an aircraft ATP (§61.165), with appropriate category and class ratings, or military/foreign equivalent, and;
2. Holds an instrument rating, or foreign equivalent, and
3. Meets the eligibility requirements of 61.153
4. Has passed the knowledge test required by 61.155
5. Meets the experience requirements of 61.161 and 61.64(d)

Prerequisite for Recurrent Course – A pilot may enroll in the 61.58(PIC) or 61.55(SIC) curriculum if the person:

1. Holds at least a Private Pilot’s Certificate with appropriate category and class ratings, or military/foreign equivalent, and;
2. Holds an instrument rating, or foreign equivalent

Prerequisite for Prior Experience Training

1. A pilot who applies for an ATP certificate must meet the eligibility requirements in §61.153 and the aeronautical knowledge and experience requirements in §61.155 and §61.161.
2. A pilot who seeks to add a type rating to a Private or Commercial Pilot Certificate must meet the eligibility requirements specified in §61.63(d) to include holding an Instrument Helicopter rating.
3. A pilot who seeks to add a type rating to an ATP certificate must meet the applicable requirements of §61.157.
4. A pilot who wishes to add the Rotorcraft Category and Helicopter Class ratings to an ATP certificate with an airplane category rating must meet applicable requirements in §61.165(a).
